We are currently in the process of posting for a new office clerk at Judah. Mrs. Perez has since resigned from her position and we are grateful for her work and the time she spent at our little neighborhood school. On October 6th, I couldn't help but to reflect upon where I was when Mathew Sheppard was brutally beaten 22 years ago for simply being gay, and tied to a fence and left to die the middle of nowhere. He was so badly beaten that and his whole body was covered in blood except for two white lines going down his face from his dried tears. Every October, schools and organizations across the country join in observing National Bullying Prevention Month. The goal is to work together to prevent Bullying and Cyberbullying by bringing awareness to the occurrence and effects of bullying on children of all ages. Theodore Judah educators will be including anti-bullying activities at school throughout their virtual classrooms this month as well as showing videos that I have provided them. October 21st is national Unity Day, and I am inviting all students to wear something orange to class that day to stand up and unite together against bullying and celebrate a more inclusive and diverse school community.
